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

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Blessing to All:

The life of Jesus Christ spanned only 33 years, but His death, gave us the invitation to have Eternal Life in Heaven. So many people know about Jesus and believe that He was crucified on the Cross for sinners. But yet, they live their lives without His grace in them, and await His judgment on where they will spend all Eternity. Our Nation is facing the abyss of moral decay. Since 1973 over 61 million babies in the womb have been killed. And yet, our Bishops and Cardinals hold back from publicly condemning a political party who advocates for the killing of God's children in the womb. The Democratic Party openly supports legislation for abortions and



supports Federal Funding of Planned Parenthood.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church in CHAPTER TWO THE HUMAN COMMUNION, paragraph # 1923 states "Political authority must be exercised within the limits of the moral order and must guarantee the conditions for the exercise of freedom." Advocating and funding abortion is not within the moral order.

We Catholics need to take heed of how we vote. God's moral law does not exempt from judgement, politicians whether they are Catholic or any other religion, who belong to a Political Party system whose Platform for the last 5 decades supports the killing of babies in the womb. The phrase 'My Body-My Choice' is of Evil origin.

How will Politicians explain to Jesus at the Judgement, that 61 million babies were killed because they supported Planned Parenthood and the right for women to get abortions for any reason or no reason! *And how will you explain to Jesus if you knowingly voted for those that help kill babies?*

Pope John Paul II, Evangelium vitae (1995), no. 59, states "But responsibility likewise falls on the legislators who have promoted and approved abortion laws, and, to the extent that they have a say in the matter, on the administrators of the health-care centers where abortions are performed. ... In this sense abortion goes beyond the responsibility of individuals and beyond the harm done to them and takes on a distinctly social dimension. It is a most serious wound inflicted on society and its culture by the very people who ought to be society's promoters and defenders...Laws which legitimize the direct killing of innocent human beings through abortion or euthanasia are in complete opposition to the inviolable right to life proper to every individual; they thus deny the equality of everyone before the law."

If you are a Catholic Christian, then vote like a Catholic Christian. The right to life is inviolable and your vote will either help kill babies or to protect the right to life for babies in the womb. We should not consider the candidate only, but the Platform of their Party on who we vote for. The Democratic Party platform is FOR ABORTION and has been for 50 years.

Is Hell Real? Luke 16:19–31 Jesus tells the story of a rich man begging Lazarus to tell the man's family not to choose hell as he did. Jesus also explains about H ell in his parable of the Sower of Seeds in Matthew 13:40-43 "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of

the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned [up] with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom* all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

The compassionate officer



Steven McDonald was a young police officer in 1986 when he was shot by a teenager in New York's Central Park, an incident that left him paralyzed. "I forgave [the shooter] because I believe the only thing worse than receiving a bullet in my spine

would have been to nurture revenge in my heart," McDonald wrote. While the younger man was serving his prison sentence, McDonald corresponded with him, hoping that one day the two could work together to demonstrate forgiveness and nonviolence. Unfortunately, the young man died in a motorcycle accident three days after his release; but McDonald still travels the country to deliver his message.

A mending feud

A domestic violence survivor, Pascale Kavanagh said that she never thought she would reconnect with her mother—her abuser—during her adult life. However, in 2010, her mother suffered several strokes that left her unable to communicate or take care of herself. With no one else to help, Kavanagh began to sit by her mother's bedside and read to her. Through this, Kavanagh says the hate she had for her mother dissipated into forgiveness and love.

Cameroon Africa-A Call to Holiness & St Peter Claver Catholic Church, Minnesota, USA



The Catholic Women's Association (CWA) Cameroon was founded in 1964 in Buea, South West Region of Cameroon (West Africa) in answer to the universal call of the lay faithful to holiness. The small group of about ten women in 1964 in Buea, Cameroon has now extended to over sixteen thousand women in all the Ecclesiastical Provinces of Cameroon and beyond including the United States of America. The CWA is recognized by the Holy See and is apolitical. A branch was started at St Peter Claver in Minnesota USA in 2015.

CWA is a full member and has full rights of the World Union of Catholic Women's Organizations (WUCWO). The Patroness of the Association is **Our Blessed Virgin Mother** whom we honor under the Title of "Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception." Our Motto, like all CWA branches all over the world, is: "To Serve And Not to Be Served." Our greeting is: "Through Mary To Jesus." Membership is open to all baptized Catholic girls or women who have completed the age of 18 years, single or married, literate or illiterate.



The Minnesota USA branch of the Catholic Women Association Cameroon had its 5th dedication ceremony on August 11, 2020, at the Church of St. Peter Claver.

These are women who have answered the call to God's vineyard and graduated from the "University of Mary" as mothers of the church by imitating the lifestyle of Mary, the Blessed Mother of Jesus.

The Minnesota branch was created on April 26th, 2015 and is recognized at the St. Peter Claver church. The branch name is Our Lady Seat of Wisdom and currently has 31 registered members. We meet bi-weekly at the St. Peter Claver Church. We organize meetings, study days, and occasional retreats to deepen our faith and inspire us for the future. We participate in church activities. Prayer is central to our work – praying the rosary, invoking the Blessed Virgin Mother to intervene on our behalf and frequent novenas.

The objectives of Catholica Women Association are the following:

- To a achieve a true renewal of the spirituality of its members.
